Jan 18, 1918

Dear Aunt "Sahara",

Papa and I have left Russellville, Ky. We stayed there three weeks. And now we are in Sanford, Florida. We are with papa's cousin. We came here last Monday. Don't know just how long we will stay. I don't think very long. So you won't need to answer this letter. I will write you again when we get settled down again. We didn't get to come as soon as I thought we

would. So we may not get to come for sometime. But we intend to come. I will let you know. We want to go to Palm Beach before we come. And if Uncle Frank is there keep him there until we come if you can. Cause papa said he was coming this morning. I'm glad to hear you are having fine weather. It has been raining here, cloudy ever since Wednesday. It don't look quite so bad today. I think it will clear off by noon. I hope we have fine weather while we are there for every place I've been it s so stormy.

I won't write to Ed this time, but will not time I write to you. Then I'll be some place where I can get an answer. I haven't got a letter from home for so long. And I'm getting pretty anxious to hear. But it takes the mail so long to come I wouldn't get it. So I keep writing to them not to write. But I'm getting of it 'cause they get all the answers and I don't get any. I wish Ed and Arthur could come out with Uncle Frank. How far is it to Aunt Jennie's since she

I will let you know when we start. I'm sorry that Aunt Jennie moved before we got there. If she lives so very far away papa might take a notion not to go there. I think he is getting kind a tired traveling so much. I know I get tired of it. Then after I rest one or two days I'm ready to go again. Well I will close and for this time and hope we will be on our way soon. As ever, Montie.
