How are you? Do hope you are well. I have written 3 letters & have not heard from you. I thought maybe you were so busy then I thought you might be sick. I hope you are feeling fine. I have not heard from Lucy or any of the folks since you left. It is very dry here. Have some pretty good

cotton, but it was hurt by the dry weather. Our tomatoes made good. Do wish you had some of them. Frankie was over & got a basket full last nite. Bill finally dug us a new cave & filled the old one up. The new one is fine. I have about 100 qts. Of fruit in it. I am awfully proud of it. Fanny & Bill Mc have gone to New Mexico to live. Fannie is in

pretty good health now. They live near Irma, New Mexico. It is a small town. That is their post office. Bill bought a section of land out there. Land is much cheaper there than here.
