We got your letter day before yesterday & have sent it to Aunt Vie. [Viola Gorham Sweet] Have not heard from any of the folks!

Hope you are still improving. I know you will get along alright as long as you have crackers and cheese, and kraut.

I have been sewing ever since you left so haven't worked any on quilts. I have

washed two days this week and don't have all the ironing done yet. Dayton's [Turner — Margaret's husband] sick so Margaret didn't help wash and we had more too. He has intestinal flu; has been sick since Sunday. They have had the Dr. every day this week. He seems to be some better now, however not out of danger.

The wind surely has been blowing here and I guess it's just about the same there as here.

What is Josh doing now? Tell him I'm behind with my

cross word puzzles. Have only worked one since he left.

Aunt Minnie, tell your son-in-law he has a name-sake. I'm going to call the baby Billy Gayland.

Grandma, how long are you going to stay up there. You didn't say a word about coming back.

I must quit and iron. Will try to write again when not as busy. Lots of love, Mildred
