Cove, 17, 1933

Dear Mother,

Not time for a long letter. Am sure you have already heard from Jack about the sad news. I came home after the funeral. I went up Tuesday morning. We certainly feel sorry for Jack and Kiddies. We went out to see the twins a boy and a girl; boy weighed 7 1/2, girl 4 1/2 I believe. It was awful I small. The folks out there were all very nice to them. It's just too bad. Do hope this finds all well there. The folks are well here except Montie. She will be sick same time next month..... is getting along fine so far. The weeds almost taken our garden while I was gone. It was almost

too hot to work out yesterday. Not bad today. We got out early today, but it slow work for two Boothe and dad are working away from home. Will be away for some time. They will be home tonight. We had strawberries for dinner. I will write again soon. Let us hear from you soon and write Jack a long letter as soon as you can.

NATIVE OF WOLFE CREEK SUCCUMBS Mrs. Stonewall J Gorham Survived by husband, 7 Children

Mrs. Stonewall J. Gorham, native resident of the Wolfe Creek section in Union county, died in St. Elizabeth's hospital at 8 o'clock this morning a few hours alter entering the institution.

Allie May Gilkison was born March 23, 1895 on the farm on which she spent her entire life. She was married to Mr. Gorham, June 1, 1911. Mrs. Gorham was a member of the Methodist Episcopal church in North Powder. She was an active member of the grange and was chairman of the Home Economics club of that organization at the time of her death.

The deceased is survived by her husband; her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert M Gilkison, of Wolfe creek; a brother, Clifford A. Gilkison of Wolfe creek; a sister, Mrs. Rose Gilkison of Portland; four daughters, Mrs. James Newman of North Powder and Olive, Audrey and Lorene Gorham; three sons, Clifford Owen, Gifford Gordon and Noel, all of Wolfe creek; twin infants, a boy and a girl; a granddaughter and a grandson.

Funeral services will be held Thursday at 2:30 p. m. In the North Powder Methodist

church with Rev. Josie Bach officiating. Interment will be in the North Powder cemetery.
