Have helped with the garden and have a bunch of little chicks. I got one hundred from the hatchery on the halves

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and have 90 of them about three weeks old. He said at that rate I'd like have you take all I have left but you know feed is so high I couldn't afford to let many of them die. I have 15 baby chicks and two more hens setting. The hens haven't set very well and my eggs didn't hatch extra good either. We have been making a garden - the onions look nice but that's

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about all. The freeze and strong winds too has been so hard on everything. The potatoes are just coming up. Our peach trees are in full bloom. Some were blooming when we had the freeze and snow. Ina came up the first Monday in March and spent the day but haven't seen her since. She said she didn't get to come to town very often, they don't have anyway of course. Mother hasn't heard from C. E.'s folks in several

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months. Ida and her family left here the first of March for South Texas. We had a card a few days later from them at Glen Rose, I think at Aunt Chester's. Harold got thrown from a cotton truck and hurt pretty bad before they left - his collar bone broken, I believe. Ina said the Dr. said at times he probably wouldn't know anything.

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I saw Mrs. Jim Holt the other day. She asked about you and I promised to let her know when you come back. Oh! Eddye Raymond said tell you — helped a man build fence this
